ADVOCACY WORK

Kalli Spencer has a long history as an advocate for men's health. In South Africa he worked hard to prevent the transmission of HIV with the NGOs, CHAPs (Centre for HIV and AIDS prevention), Right to Care and the Anova health institute. Outreach work included radio, tv and community talks for the Pink Drive, Prostate Cancer Foundation South Africa, Movember SA and Brother's for Life in the fight against prostate cancer, testicular cancer, penile cancer and breast cancer. Touring around Johannesburg with the Just One Teenager program he educated the youth about sexual health. In Australia he has continued his advocacy work with the Prostate Cancer foundation, facilitating various community prostate cancer support groups. He is also one of the co-founders of the new Australian Bladder Cancer Charity, BEAT. He developed the charities online content and is the founder of the first face to face support group for survivors in collaboration with the Cancer Council NSW and most recently a virtual national online support group.

AWARDS

Kalli Spencer was recognised as one of South Africa's Top 200 Youth on the Mail & Guardian list for the most notable young SAs under the age of 35 in 2017 for his advocacy work in the field of oncology and sexual health education.

He also received a young colleague award from the South African Medical Association recognizing his work in the community.
